

If you've been around church much, you've probably heard the word "gospel" thrown around a lot. As Christians, we talk a lot about the gospel but we can sometimes be a little fuzzy on what it actually is. I've heard some explanations over the years that left me a little confused and I've probably confused some people by my own fuzzy explanations. Maybe you've had the same experience. As a

young Christian, I knew that the gospel was good news. Or, at least that's what the preacher and my youth group leaders said but I probably couldn't explain why it was so good.

As Jesus' disciples, we know we're supposed to share the gospel with other people. But, it's hard to do that if we don't really understand it ourselves. In fact, we can talk ourselves out of sharing Jesus with someone because we're afraid we won't be able to explain something or answer a question. I know I feel that way sometimes. The core of the gospel really isn't that hard to understand or even to explain. But, it can be really hard for some people to accept.

This past Sunday evening, we spent some time talking about what the gospel is and how it impacts our lives. Next Sunday evening at 6 PM, we're going to talk about how to share the gospel with someone. I encourage you to join us as we learn and maybe even practice some easy and practical ways to share the gospel. I hope you'll join us and bring a friend. This would be a great way for a non-Christian to hear and learn more about the gospel for themselves.

And, I encourage you to read ahead this week as we prepare to gather together to worship and to study God's Word. We'll talk about Luke 19:45-20:19. We look forward to worshiping with you on Sunday. Have a great week!







Sharing the Gospel



