Disciple Notes

Week of June 22, 2026



One thing is almost always true when a leader tries to bring about change, whether it's in a business, a team, an organization, a family, etc. There will be opposition. Not always but usually. There'll often be those within and those on the outside who resist the change. And, the opposition can be for a variety of reasons. The person may feel threatened by the changes. They may feel like they're going to lose

their power or influence because the current situation benefits them and their interests. Or, they may feel like the changes aren't warranted. They like things the way they are and believe that change will only makes things worse. There can be lots of reasons to oppose change.

And, the methods of opposition can vary. Some opposition is out in the open while others may work behind the scenes to try to frustrate the work. Still others may give the appearance of support but lobby to slow down or delay the work in hopes that the changes will die on the vine over time. Some opposition can be physical while others can be verbal, psychological, or emotional, trying to create fear in the leader or in other people who'll be impacted. And, of course, there's also spiritual opposition. Regardless of the method, the goal is to stop the change.

Nehemiah faced all of that. Resistance from within his team. Overt opposition and threats from those outside the team. Fear. Physical threats. But, he didn't give in and he helped his team stand firm.

How can we do that? How can we stand strong when change is needed, maybe in our own lives, but the opposition is strong and threatening? We're going to look at that this week in Nehemiah 4. I encourage you to read ahead and consider how Nehemiah handled opposition. Have a great week and bring a friend to church. There's always room for one more. See you on Sunday!
